Monday January 23, 2017

- Mrs. Kutzley in to speak about PSAT scores

Tuesday January 24, 2017

- Pre-test- do not answer if you do not know it.
- Discuss background for William Shakespeare, The Globe Theater, and Ancient Rome.
- Introduce *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar*.
 - Discuss exposition in drama.
 - Dialogue
 - Text aids
- Assign parts for reading.
- Objective- Students will learn the background of the Shakespearean play *The Tragedy of Julius Caesar* to aid in understanding the play.

Wednesday January 25, 2017

- Begin reading the play stopping often to check for understanding.
 - What is the feeling in Rome?
 - How do people feel about Caesar?
 - What conflict is beginning to develop?
 - Where does the exposition begin and end?
- Objective- Students will read a play in order to determine the plot elements being presented.

Thursday, January 26, 2017

- Finish reading Act I.
- What is Cassius plan for Brutus?
- How will he accomplish this?
- How doe the atmosphere of Rome reflect the mood of the play?
- Objective- Students will respond to the elements of the play by discussing the mood and tone created by the author.

Friday, January 27, 2017

- Listen to an audio recording of Act I.
- Complete worksheet on using text aids and exposition in drama.
- Objective- Students will re-enforce their understanding of the play by listening to an audio version.

Standards
