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# Monday, May 8, 2017

- ▶ Read *The In-Between* (63-74)
  - ▶ Discuss
  - ▶ Write a response to the following quote:
    - ▶ “Not aging is not the same as living, and without human contact, his soul dried up.”
- ▶ Objective: Students will read and analyze a novel.

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# Tuesday, May 9, 2017

- ▶ Review connotation and denotation
  - ▶ Denotation is the literal meaning of words
  - ▶ Connotation is the implied meaning of a word
- ▶ Complete exercise
- ▶ Objective: Students will determine the connotation and denotation of selected words from the novel.

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# Wednesday, May 10, 2017

- ▶ Read the section “Falling” (pp. 76-86)
  - ▶ What is the Old Man’s message to Dor?
    - ▶ Does Dor understand his purpose?
    - ▶ What does the author mean when he states: “It is never too late or too soon. It is when it is supposed to be.”
  - ▶ Explain the following quote: “You were one person, and you changed the world”
    - ▶ How did Dor change the world?
    - ▶ How can this idea be applied to your own life and our world? Give specific examples.

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# Thursday, May 11, 2017

- ▶ Read “Earth” (pp. 89-104)
- ▶ Objective: Students will read and analyze a novel.

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# Friday, May 12, 2017

- ▶ Discuss literary devices used in the novel.
  - ▶ Define: Metonymy, Metaphor, Simile, Personification, motif, synecdoche
  - ▶ Find examples from the reading.
- ▶ Students will define literary terms and apply those terms to the reading.
